
Monarch butterflies, crowns or halos, and the ensō all symbolise fragility and strength, a celebration of life, absolute enlightenment, elegance, the universe, and mu (the void).

Featuring a diverse range of mediums and techniques, the exhibition invites the viewer to find beauty and hope in even the darkest moments and to embrace the endless possibilities for growth and change within us all.

Luke McMullan's introduction to art came through writing graffiti in the 90s when he adopted the pseudonym 'Stix'. He has been honing his craft ever since, and although he no longer paints on walls, graffiti's organic and adaptive nature is at the foundation of the art he produces today.

## August 12 – 29 | **Tom Kenny's Old Galway** *Heritage Week 2023*

An Exhibition of Photographs, celebrating 50 years of Tom's Galway Advertiser newspaper column. Forty-five Galway City images from the 19th and 20th centuries.

# Official opening by the Mayor of Galway City, Cllr Eddie Hoare on Saturday August 12, at 3:00pm.

Curated by local historian Tom Kenny, the images will depict a social history of Galway city in the late 19th and 20th centuries. Photographs of various city streets including Quay Street and Cross Street, market scenes, old shops and residences, workers, sporting activities and transport are all represented. Many of the images are printed on a very large scale, every detail a talking point!

Tom Kenny has been a local historian in Galway for most of his life and this year sees the celebration of his fiftieth year writing weekly Old Galway columns on the city's history for the Galway Advertiser newspaper. He also co-hosts a weekly Old Galway Diary podcast together with Ronnie O'Gorman.

The exhibition will be launched at 3pm on Saturday, August 12th by Mayor of Galway city, Cllr Eddie Hoare and all are welcome. The exhibition is being funded by Galway City Council.

Tom Kenny's Old Galway will run from Saturday August 12th-29th at The Kenny Gallery, Liosbán Retail Park, Tuam Road, Galway (open Monday-Saturday 9am-5pm). A selection of the images are for sale.





Tom Kenny has been publishing old photographs of Galway every week in the Galway Advertiser since the early 1970s, marking 50 years in 2023. He has built up an important archive of images which could be said to represent a visual social history of the city over a period of about 150 years. This exhibition is a kind of trawl through our heritage, a selection of photographs of different vintages and illustrating the changing streetscapes, the fairs and markets, some of the games and pastimes, the different styles of dress and some of the characters of yesteryear.

## September 1 – 26 | **Kenneth Webb**

Webb, 70 Years at Kennys

#### Official opening Friday September 1

A 70-year relationship between an artist and a gallery is likely unprecedented, certainly in Irish terms, but that is how long the painter Kenneth Webb and Kennys have been working together.

Since he first walked in their door in Galway, both the gallery and the artist's work have gone through many changes. He has painted his way through a variety of themes and into a world-wide reputation.

In all those years there has always been one constant in his work, colour!


For Webb, at 96 years of age, colour is still magical and exciting, and induces in him great bouts of painting.

His work has been described as 'homage to the secret life of colour', and he's certainly a dedicated painter, always driven to bold new experiments in paint.

This exhibition includes a return to some favourite subjects for Kenneth, the bogs and bog pools, the wildflowers and rocks of Connemara – and we also have a number of important retrospective works to augment the vibrant new paintings.

The exhibition will continue daily 9.00-5.00, Monday to Saturday until September 26 - admission is free and all are welcome.

# **John Behan RHA**Across the Bitter Sea

New Sculpture | September 30 – October 24, 2023 | The Kenny Gallery, Galway

*Across the Bitter Sea* is a collection of new works in bronze by renowned sculptor John Behan.

Behan, who recently featured in a major film documentary biography by Donald Taylor Black, perhaps Ireland's pre-eminent artist in his medium, celebrates 50 years exhibiting at Kennys.

Primarily a continuation of the artist's important 'migrants' work, including striking new versions of his iconic famine ship, the exhibition will also feature explorations of Ukrainian migrant themes.

Classic Behans, in the form of flights of birds and bulls, will also be exhibited in what demonstrates an artist at the height of his powers.

The exhibition will be officially opened at the Kenny Gallery on Saturday 30th September by poet John F. Deane.

The artist dedicates this exhibition to the memory of Fr. Kevin O'Neill.






John Behan, Famine Ship, Bronze, 18x18x10in



Jay Murphy was born in Dublin in 1952. She studied at the Dun Laoghaire School of Art and the Central School in London. She travelled in Switzerland and Bavaria before returning to Ireland to live in Connemara.

She is a founder member of Fioruisce and of Western Artists. She has illustrated a number of books, notably Gonella and Litany for the Pig by Eva Bourke.

Her work has appeared in numerous group shows, and one person exhibitions in the Stone Gallery, at An Dámhlann in Spiddal, the Lincoln Gallery, Dublin, the Carroll Gallery, Longford, the Kenny Gallery, Galway and the Galway Arts Festival.

Recently enchanted and inspired by a particular magical place, this collection is a tribute to the garden landscape created by Lorna McMahon in Galway. **Lorna's Garden**, a collection of oils and pastels comes to the Kenny Gallery at the end of October and runs for almost four weeks, don't miss it!
